Ladies Stroke Play

- Stroke Play - 100% handicap differential (using course handicap)
 - Golfer 1 Handicap 10 - 4 = 6 (Receive 6 strokes)
 - Golfer 2 Handicap 4
- All golfers **MUST** possess a current and valid GAO handicap prior to the first match. Any golfer playing a match without a current and valid GAO will automatically forfeit that match.
 - GAO handicap can be purchased in the pro shop or online at <https://gao.ca/golfer-membership/>
- All golfers **WILL** play from the **Yellow Tees**
- Golfer on the top bracket is responsible for booking the match, however, bottom bracket golfer can also initiate contact
- Match **MUST** be completed by posted date
 - Incomplete matches will be provided one (1) tee time determined by the Ladies Golf Committee.
 - If either golfer can not participate in this match, the match will be determined by a two (2) out of three (3) coin flip performed by the Ladies Golf Committee
- All grievances and/or rule challenges will be directed to and resolved by the Ladies Golf Committee

Definition of Medal Stroke Play

Medal play, also known as **stroke play**, is a golf format in which the total number of strokes is counted over one, or more rounds, of 18 holes. In stroke play, the winner is the player who has taken the fewest strokes over the course of the round, or rounds.

In handicapped competitions, the players would subtract their handicaps from the total (gross) score to generate their net scores, and the player with the lowest net score is the winner.
